# Plan for huge cemetery

#### TRUST SEEKS 136,000 GRAVES TO OVERCOME SHORTAGE OF BURIAL SPACE

A NEW 136,000 gravesite plan for the Scenic Hills could help meet increasing demand for cemetery space, but not everyone agrees the location is suitable.

Catholic Metropolitan Cemeteries Trust will sub-mit a rezoning proposal to Campbelltown Council to make land at St Andrews Rd, Varroville, suitable for the Macarthur Memorial Park.

The memorial park would deliver 136,000 graves over the next 100 years for all denominations.

The trust believes burial spaces in the Sydney area will be absorbed by 2058. At the Macarthur level, burial

## **\$53m for** Narellan Rd upgrade

IN the biggest Macarthur region election sweetener so far, the Coalition has prom-ised to inject \$53 million into the Narellan Rd upgrade if elected at Saturday's federal poll. Opposition

Opposition treasury spokesman Joe Hockey joined Macarthur federal Liberal MP Russell Mathe-son yesterday to announce the funding to address con-gestion on the road. In June the State Govern-ment announced \$4.9 mil-

ment announced \$4.9 million for the project in its 2013-14 budget with the work receiving planning approval last month.

The upgrade involves construction of three lanes in both directions, new traffic lights at Kenny Hill Rd and after the bridge on the Campbelltown side, a shared pedestrian and cycle path and widening of the southbound exit ramp.

Mr Matheson said the

Coalition's proposed invest-ment in the stretch was great news. "This shows the Coalition's commitment to improving infrastructure in the southwest growth corridor," he said.
